The Department congratulate Talitha Bromwich on her success in Parliament

The Department recently hosted a drinks event to celebrate Talitha Bromwich's success in Parliament. Talitha won 'most outstanding project' at an exhibition in Parliament on 25 February 2014.

Talitha, now in the final year of her MPhys degree at Sussex, spent last summer working on the DEAP3000 dark-matter detector after being selected for the University's Junior Research Associate scheme.

The JRA scheme is an opportunity for talented and ambitious undergraduate students to participate in original research with staff and other members of the University community.

Her project won first prize at the University's JRA poster exhibition in October, and she was then chosen to present her findings – alongside undergraduate researchers from 22 other universities – in Westminster as part of the annual Posters in Parliament exhibition.

The event was attended by the University Vice Chancellor, Professor Michael Farthing.
